**2005**. Beginning 7 years (and counting) of **Emergency Shelter** Grants awarded by State of Florida, Department of Children and Families. The grants have helped fund upgrades to the 3 houses, including repainting, new windows, and new A/C & heat systems.

AS I REFLECT on my 35 years starting and volunteering with Genesis House, Inc., I am amazed at how God has led us into sheltering so many women and

children (over 13,000). When the idea of providing

shelter to homeless pregnant women came to us in 1977, I did not think about the long-term effects we would have on so many lives, and I had no idea I would still be so involved 35 years later. I also had no idea we would have three shelter homes and have housing for student mothers with their children and a home for homeless mothers and their children.

In 1977, the bank loan officers I approached, and a number of friends, all told me it was an impossible goal to buy a house to shelter homeless women with only the belief that people would send donations. They said we would never to able to find the support and donations we



would need to do it. In spite of their discouraging words we moved forward with our plan by renting our first house for one year and then being approved by a sympathetic banker who

gave us a balloon mortgage. During the first 17 years we were able to completely staff and do all our administration work with no paid staff, only volunteers.

Many churches, organizations, and individuals sent us donations, large and small, making it possible to pay our expenses and pay off all three mortgages. I am very proud of and grateful to our supporters for all their help making our 35 years of Genesis House possible.

I am in awe of all the volunteers in our community, from 1977 through present day, who have stepped forward to help support and improve our three beautiful shelter

homes. I wish everyone reading this could see the love radiated by the groups and individuals who volunteer their time helping our residents and improving our three shelter homes. The volunteers have come from church groups of all



ages and from all faiths, civic groups, corporations, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, public and private schools, and caring individuals. We also receive food from the Postal and Boy Scout food drives. We have Webster University graduate school interns who volunteer to help our residents. Over the years volunteers have done projects such as enlarging all three kitchens and making two additional bedrooms from unused spaces. Volunteers have renovated or improved every room in our three houses. We presently have several church groups renovating all three houses and our "Free Boutique," which has donated items for our current and past residents. These volunteers are busy painting bedrooms, redecorating, building a wall to close off a laundry/food storage area, landscaping, and many other projects. We have had 3,537 volunteer hours so far this year.

I am so proud of the successes of our past residents. I have received letters, phone calls, emails, and pictures from many of them. They are all over the USA, making their mark, improving their lives and the lives of others. A former resident recently called me from Wisconsin asking for advice on starting a shelter home in her area. She said she has a good life now and wants to help other women who need help as she did many years ago.

when he was born. This mother came back with her son about 5 years later to become our house



manager for 3 years. She is now on our Board of Advisors.

One of my recent phone calls was from a child, now grown. He started out his life at Genesis House with an angry, stubborn mother who had very low selfesteem and no confidence in herself or trust of



others. He was an ill baby with muscle development problems. He went to physical therapy three times a week. His mother reluctantly earned her GED and started college. She discovered that she was very smart and a wonderful writer. He told me how grateful he is for all the help and encouragement I gave him and

his mother from the time of his birth, early childhood, and when they returned to live at Genesis House II while his mother finished college and he finished grade school. His mother was on the Dean's List and he had a straight-A report card. He is now in college and plans to go into the military.

The mom featured on the front cover is a former resident. She now lives in Southern California and is an actress and executive producer of a film related to pregnancy and women living in maternity homes. Her son is now in the U.S. Marines, served two tours of duty in Iraq, and recently married.

We will now work on our next 35 years. Please help us with your donations and volunteer time.
